MINUTES

MATTERS ARISING

556/2020 Field Opposite Bronllys Garage – The Clerk reported that she had heard nothing further from Gemma Bufton, Planning Officer regarding this. It was agreed that Cllr Colbert chase this with Planning.

609/2022 Bench for Llyswen – Cllr Hughes reported that she has ordered a bench and a plaque. This will be a commemorative bench to mark the King’s coronation in May 2023.

610/2023 Parking, Bronllys Garage – The Clerk reported that she had received a reply from PCSO Emma Jackson – “I have noticed this and due to no parking restrictions in place no action can be taken. By all means I can speak with staff. I have noticed that some vehicles park over the walk way along the garage, this is considerate and this can be addressed. Otherwise it’s a highway issue. In one way, it slows traffic down. I shall update you once I have attended”.

611/2023 Grass Cutting Tender – The Clerk reported that this is now out for tender with a closing date of 6th March, 2023.

612/2023 Resignation of Community Council – The Clerk reported that the process for recruiting a new Community Councillor for Llyswen is in process.
