**DECLARATION OF INTEREST**

There were no declarations of interest expressed.

**MINUTES**

The minutes of the meeting held on the 9<sup>th</sup> July, 2025 were read, agreed and confirmed as a correct record. This was proposed by Cllr Bouette and seconded by Cllr Hughes.

**MATTERS ARISING**

660/2025 Planning Update – With regard to the residential development of 17 dwellings and all associated works on the former Bronllys CP School site Cllr Bouette reported that Mr. Terry Hurford, Named Representative of the Bronllys Green Group and being an applicant to register a Village Green has received notification from Sian Barnes, Professional Lead, Countryside Access and Recreation that Powys County Council have commissioned an Inspector via Planning and Environment Decisions Wales (PEDW) to hold a non-statutory hearing in respect of this case. The Council will use the Inspector’s report and recommendations to make a decision about the application. PEDW have now allocated an Inspector to hear this case and the Inspector is available to hold a hearing over three days from Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> – Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2025. This will be a daytime hearing and in person at a venue close to the application site as possible.

661/2025 Parking Issues, Bronllys – The Clerk reported that she had received a reply from Trudy Davies, PCSO to the effect “the police will only attend parking issues if the road is being obstructed. From what you describe, this is an obstruction so I would encourage whoever is being obstructed to call at the time so assistance can be provided. For a more permanent

solution, I would enquire about any parking restrictions, i.e. double yellow lines. From memory, I believe the junction in question has double yellow lines. Therefore, this would be a matter for the Civil Enforcement Officers. I would suggest you contact Powys County Council and highlight your concerns as well as requesting patrols. I would also encourage Traws Cymru to contact Powys County Council if their drivers are being affected. And if it is only patrons frequenting the Cock Hotel who are causing the obstruction, then I would suggest you engage with the proprietors and seek their assistance in preventing further obstructions”.

Following discussion it was agreed that as no further complaints have been raised that this situation be monitored in the first instance.

662/2025 30mph/20mph Signs Bronllys – The Clerk reported that Powys County Council have cut back vegetation on the exit lane verge leaving the village. The Highways Inspector has also raised a works order for HCSS tractor flail to cut a visibility splay the other side of the signage so the signage will be clear on the approach from Brecon.

With regard to the 20mph speed limit Powys County Council consulted upon changes to the 20 limits which resulted in a request to review this section by a member of the public. Powys County Council undertook the assessment and concluded that there was no justification to change its position. They will therefore not consider moving the sign towards the hospital roundabout.

663/2025 Powys Teaching Health Board – The Clerk reported that a reply had been received in regard to waiting times for planned care from July 2025 to the effect:

“From the beginning of July 2025, all planned care in Wales was delivered based on NHS Wales waiting time measures, and all planned care in England was delivered based on NHS England waiting time measures.

Residents of Powys should be treated in the same time frame as residents of anywhere else in Wales. The change aligns the waiting times for new and existing referrals to NHS England providers with the current position for Welsh providers. This ensures a consistent approach across all services commissioned by the Health Board for all of our residents and ensures consistency with residents across the rest of Wales. This change does NOT include:

- Cancer referrals
- Urgent and emergency referrals
- Appointments for people under 18
- People resident outside Powys (including if you are registered with a Powys GP.
- Follow up appointments and your ongoing care for long term conditions, e.g. diabetes.

This is not a decision we have taken lightly and it reflects the way we are funded. As a publicly-funded organisation, we have a responsibility to manage our finances wisely, for now and the

future. It is vital that we live within our means. We cannot continue to spend money we do not have, to offer faster access care to some parts of the county. Instead, we need to take a fairer approach that protects essential services for everyone”.

Cllr Lewis had contacted the Clerk to raise the following issues:

- 20mph signs as you go up the Court Road – the signs are buried in the hedge and not visible – **The Clerk will log a job with PCC.**
- Could the plastic bollard that has been destroyed by Morrisons garage be removed. It looks a mess and pointless being replaced as it will be whacked again – **Cllr Williams has removed the bollard.**
- No. 1 Old Council House – the hedge needs cutting as it is creeping out into the road – **The Clerk will contact the owner of the house.**
- Could we ask that the road sweeper go around the village and also if the drains could be cleaned before we get too much rain – **The Clerk will log a job with PCC.**
- New housing estate with the black houses – looking very unsightly as there are holes in the hedge, the verges look a mess and it is just an eyesore in the village. – **Agreed that the Clerk contact the estate agents Key Executive Sales for details of the builders.**

Cllr Hughes raised that the hedge by the War Memorial is overgrown and needs cutting back. It was agreed that Cllr Hughes get somebody to do this work.
