**DECLARATION OF INTEREST**

Cllr Laurie-Parry declared an interest in the two planning applications.

**MINUTES**

The minutes of the meeting held on the 30<sup>th</sup> August, 2017 were read, agreed and confirmed as a correct record. Proposed by Cllr Hughes and seconded by Cllr Wormleighton.

**MATTERS ARISING**

389/2014 Royston Hall Management Committee – The Clerk reported that she had received an E Mail from Mrs. Lesley Emerson to ask if the Management Committee are entitled to any for any funding that is available to community groups. This was agreed and the Clerk will forward an application form to the Management Committee.

With regard to the draft management agreement the Management Committee have suggested some amendments and would like to meet to discuss this. It was agreed that Cllr H. Lewis (Chair) and Cllr Mrs. S. Lewis (Vice Chair) arrange to meet with the Management Committee before the next meeting.

393/2014 Powys Wellbeing Group – Cllr Hughes reported there was nothing further to report.

452/2017 Lighting by Honey Café, Bronllys – The Clerk reported that she is still waiting to hear from Leigh Williams as to when work will commence.

453/2017 Primary Schools Llyswen and Talgarth – Cllr Laurie-Parry reported that Highways are responsible for keeping the pathway clear. The Councillors remain concerned that the pathway from the roundabout to Talgarth is unsafe. Cllr Lloyd reported that members of the public need to contact the Police by ringing 101 to report all near misses and to receive a crime reference. Cllr Laurie-Parry agreed to write to the Health and Safety Executive regarding this matter and will copy councillors into the E Mail.

456/2017 Dog Fouling Signs – As Cllr Lewis was not present there was nothing further to report.

464/2017 Griffin Inn, Llyswen – The Clerk reported that she has written to Brains but has received no reply to date.

467/2017 Litter Pick, Bronllys – As Cllr Lewis was not present there was nothing further to report.

472/2017 Powys War Memorial Project – The Clerk reported that the two application forms have been submitted.

473/2017 Speed Indicator Devices, Llyswen – Cllr Laurie-Parry reported that she had met with Gareth Day, Dean Williams and Kirsty Williams and it was agreed that the speed signs be moved further out of the village. It was also agreed that tiger lines would be put on the highway at all three ends of the village. Extra signs will also be erected.

Cllr Hughes and Cllr Lloyd asked again if costings can be got for flashing lights and speed indicator devices for the village. Cllr Laurie-Parry agreed to follow this up.

475/2017 Visit to the Palace of Westminster – The Clerk reported that she had received a reply from Chris Davies to say that tour bookings for March and April 2018 are not accepted by the Houses of Parliament until early November. Following discussion it was agreed that we get some prices for a 29 seater bus and then put it out to see how many in the community are interested in attending. Cllr Laurie-Parry agreed to get some prices for buses.

476/2017 School Governor for Ysgol Y Mynydd Du, Talgarth – The Clerk reported that the letter we received was misleading and it was asking for one Councillor from either Talgarth Town Council or Bronllys Community Councillor to act as governor for a period of 4 years. As it stands Cllr Jackie Wilding from Talgarth is the current representative. Following discussion it was agreed that Cllr Wilding continue in this role for the next 4 years.

477/2017 Rubbish Bin, Llyswen – The Clerk reported that she had contacted Powys County Council regarding relocating the bin but they have forwarded the request to the Trunk Road Agency as it is on the trunk road.

478/2017 Overgrown Trees, Llyswen – Cllr Lloyd reported that she has spoken to Jan Credland and he will cut the trees back within the next month.

479/2017 Bus Stop Information – This has now been completed.

480/2017 Hedge Opposite Court Meadow – The Councillors were unsure as to whether the hedge had been cut at this stage.

## **CORRESPONDENCE**

Planning Application – P/2017 0995 – Erection of an extension to the rear of the dwelling and a porch to the front at 6 Pontywal Lane, Bronllys – There were no objections voiced.

Planning Application – P/2017/0998 – For full: Change of use of land from agricultural to tourism. Installation of 2 no. shepherd huts (retrospective) at Plaswye, Llysven – There were no objections voiced apart from Cllr Lloyd having a concern with regard to there only being a right hand turn when existing the property.

A letter was received from Bernard Eacock Ltd. Notifying the Community Council that they are intending to apply for planning permission to erect 10 dwellings on Talgarth Road, Bronllys.

A letter was received from Geraint John Planning notifying the Community Council that they are intending to apply for planning permission to erect 14 dwellings at Greenfields, Bronllys.

A letter was received from the local branch of the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Fund asking for financial assistance. It was proposed by Cllr Hughes and seconded by Cllr Wormleighton that we give £100.00.

Cllr Hughes asked Cllr Laurie-Parry how the recent meeting had gone with regard to the LDP in Llysven. Cllr Laurie-Parry reported that she had been approached by a resident of Llysven with regard to the third stage development of Llys Meillion and Cllr Laurie-Parry had arranged a meeting for residents to attend. There is a stream running through the field and residents are concerned about flooding when the third stage commences. Cllr Laurie-Parry reported that there is another development in another area of Powys that has similar issues and they have formed an action group and are working with the Queen's Council. Their barrister has queried the planning officers principle with regard to planning policies. This is ongoing and Cllr Laurie-Parry will keep the Community Council updated with progress.
