MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held on the 1st May, 2019 were read, agreed and confirmed as a correct record. This was proposed by Cllr Williams and seconded by Cllr Lloyd.

MATTERS ARISING

<u>473/2017 Speed Indicator Devices</u> – The Clerk reported that the police were unable to attend this meeting due to prior commitments but will attend the next meeting in July. Cllr Laurie-Parry reported that she had had costings for the speed indicator devices which are £3,000 each plus running costs.

<u>486/2018 Play Area Pontywal Lane</u> – Cllr Laurie-Parry reported that she had been told by Steve Butcher that there is £10,000 available for Bronllys for play equipment. It was agreed that the Clerk apply for this funding.
